



NB'S CURLING CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL RETURN TO THE ICE AFTER TWO LONG YEARS

Curling clubs across the province send their top club level teams to compete.

MARCH 22, 2022 [SAINT JOHN, NB] – After two long years of event cancellations and postponements due to COVID-19, curling clubs across New Brunswick are excited to send their top club level teams to Thistle-St. Andrews (TSA) Curling Club in Saint John on March 24-27, 2022, to compete for the NB Curling Club Championships men's and women's titles.

This event is designed to promote club play, not elite or super league play, providing recreational adult curlers the opportunity to compete in a provincial championship.

"I've been a competitive athlete my entire life and the sport of curling and this event gives me the chance to still compete and win," said Kim Dow, a TSA curler competing in the Club Championships. "The challenges of not being able to compete during COVID-19 were difficult. We had to stay motivated during a lot of uncertainty. We had to transition from competing against others to competing against ourselves – practicing skills on our own and playing against other teams whenever that was possible."

A total of 76 club curlers, made up of 19 teams, representing 9 NB curling clubs will hit the ice this weekend and feel the sense of competition once again.
